SEWER MAINTENANCE WORKER I

Definition:

Under direct supervision, assists in the maintenance of sewer collection systems and wastewater treatment facilities and does related work as required.

Distinguishing Characteristics

This is the entry level in the Sewer Maintenance Worker flexible series. The Sewer Maintenance Worker I is distinguished from the Sewer Maintenance Worker II by the level of training and experience. Promotion is considered on a merit basis based on acquiring the required training and experience, and is subject to recommendation by the Department head and approval of the Director of Personnel.

Essential Functions:

- Performs routine maintenance, cleaning and videoing of sewer lines.
- Disassembles and cleans sewer pumps.
- Assists with repairs to sewer pump motors.
- Carries out extermination program to control cockroaches, rats and other vectors.
- Operates maintenance equipment and vehicles, and ensures compliance with safety requirements.
- Performs repairs and preventive maintenance for sewer maintenance and treatment facility equipment.
- Responds to emergency sewer stoppage calls and works with the public.
- Completes sewer maintenance, overflow and emergency response reports.
- Cleans treatment plant structures and assists in major repairs.
- Works as a member of the Confined Space Entry crew.
- Ingress and egress from 20-foot deep sewer manholes; ascend and descend 25-foot metal ladder affixed to the side of a wall; performs hard physical labor; repeatedly lifts 50 pounds, occasionally lifts 100 pounds; removes and replaces sewer manhole covers weighing 205 pounds.
- Performs other job-related duties as assigned.

Employment Standards:

Completion of High School or possession of a G.E.D.

License Required:

Must possess and maintain a valid Class "B" California driver's license with brake and tank endorsements.

Some Positions May Require:

Attainment of California Water Environment Association certification in appropriate sewer maintenance, mechanical or electrical categories may be required, depending upon assignment.

Additional Requirement:

As a condition of employment, the incumbent must reside within 30 minutes normal driving time of the Kern Sanitation Authority's wastewater treatment plant located at 4101 Kimber Avenue, Bakersfield, California.

Knowledge of: basic mathematics, the use of hand tools common to the building trades.

Ability to: follow oral and written directions; apply mathematical and mechanical aptitudes; read and understand equipment maintenance manuals and low-level technical manuals; establish and maintain cooperative working relationships; repair maintenance equipment.

A background check may be conducted for this classification.

All Kern County employees are designated "Disaster Service Workers" through state and local laws (CA Government Code Sec. 3100-3109 and Ordinance Code Title 2-Administration, Ch. 2.66 Emergency Services). As Disaster Service Workers, all County employees are expected to remain at work, or to report for work as soon as practicable, following a significant emergency or disaster.
